Wyoming:

- Yellowstone National Park
 - Rust appeared on pines about 1950
 - 1948 *Ribes* eradication in Mount Washburn area
 - 1964 *Ribes* eradication in Glen Creek area (40 acres)
- Shoshone National Forest
 - Rust appeared on pines about 1966
 - 1936 *Ribes* eradication in Brooks Lake area
- Medicine Bow National Forest
 - Rust appeared on pines about 1980
 - 1936 *Ribes* eradication in Pole Mountain area

Eradication of *Ribes* species occurred in advance of the arrival of white pine blister rust in several locations in Wyoming and Colorado from 1930 – 1964

Colorado:

- Rocky Mountain National Park
 - No rust on pines as of 2005
 - 1953-1963 *Ribes* eradication in Longs Peak-Estes Cone and Boulder Brook areas (2,500 acres); areas on "maintenance" program
 - 1964 *Ribes* eradication in Hidden Valley Ski Area
- Pike and San Isabel National Forest
 - Rust on pines appeared at Mosca pass about 1995
 - 1936 *Ribes* eradication in Beaver Creek area
